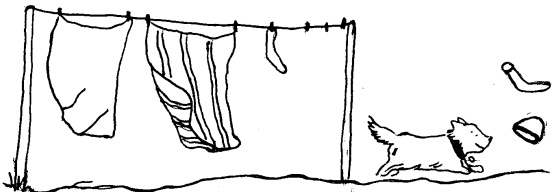


Vowel Poetry
